# WHAT IS IT?

practical managerial, communication and business decision-making skills. Many units thus incorporate latest Work Integrated Learning (WIL) pedagogy and practices.

*CTI English Entry requirement: Credit in English or English Literature at O level or a pass at A Level English or a minimum of c grade in GP. Alternatively, internationally recognized test of academic English e.g. IELTS, TOEFL etc...*
