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WHAT IS IT?

The Certificate IV in Preparation for Health and Nursing Studies is an Australian accredited course which provides students with the academic and practical skills needed to progress to higher education nursing and health related qualifications.

The course covers a wide range of topics, including anatomy and physiology, medical terminology, infection control together with an introduction to science applied to health. Additionally, the course helps student develop the essential academic and writing skills required for success at University.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Four (4) Credits O-Levels or equivalent or completed HLT37215 Certificate III in Pathology Collection or HLT33115 Certificate III in Health Services Assistance
- Credit in English at O-Levels, or pass CTE English Entrance Test

Alternatively, Candidates gain entry through a portfolio submission followed by an entrance exam and an interview conducted in English.
