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WHAT IS IT?

Health Care Assistants play a vital role in promoting patient well-being and facilitating the smooth delivery of healthcare. They work in partnership with registered nurses and other medical practitioners to improve the quality of life of patients with diverse needs and in a variety of health facilities such as hospitals, clinics, aged care centres and home care.

The Certificate III in Health Services Assistance course is awarded by South Metro TAFE of Western Australia and prepares trainees for a career as a **Health Care Assistant**. In this course, the following will be covered:

- Communication and customer service
- Providing Personal Care to patients
- Mobility and Rehabilitation
- Infection control
- Work health and safety
- Medical terminology
- Provide First Aid.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Four (4) O-Levels or equivalent
- Credit in English at O-Levels, or pass CTE English Entrance Test

Alternatively, Candidates can gain entry through a portfolio submission followed by an entrance exam and an interview conducted in English.

BECOMING A HEALTH CARE ASSISTANT

This course will help you develop the following attributes required for success as a Health Care Assistant:

- Caring and respectful approach when interacting with patients and colleagues
- Ability to measure monitor patient vital signs
- Ability to implement care plans
- Ability to observe and respond to non-verbal cues or changes in patient's behaviour
- Able to work co-operatively within a multidisciplinary team
- Computer literacy and accurate recording skills
